5 Representations from Parishioners. Any comments, views or requests? Cars parking at the B4380/Bicton Lane junction are an ongoing problem. BPC will ask SC for its view on whether double vellow lines would be appropriate. Kevin Williams tried to strim the Montford Crescent hammerhead but parked cars make this very difficult. Vans have been parking on the B4380 opposite Bicton Lane, this has resulted in some damage to the grass. The parking, or the Four Crosses Garage slip road, continues. This is potentially dangerous but the car sales business is busy and sometimes it does not have enough parking space; also the Four Crosses is now in a 40mph speed limit, which, in theory, makes the road safer. Muriel's Little Wood is attracting rooks, this leads to lots of droppings in the wood, but that's nature for you. The Brethren have picked the litter off Grange Bank; hearty thanks are sent to them.

6 Bicton Village Hall, car park improvements, a report. The Village Hall Committee intends to improve the car park. The plans have been put on hold because it was necessary to proceed with the installation of the photo-voltaic panels to gain the benefit of the feed-in-tariff scheme. When the VH committee is able to allocate resources to the car park BPC can give consideration to spending some of the CIL money on this project.

9.1 The verges of Isle Lane are being damaged by large agricultural machinery. The Tate's tenant farmer (Suckley) have planted 30 acres of onions on the Isle. The associated machinery has caused much of the damage.
