NEIGHBOURHOOD ALERT, REPORT.

OPEN FORUM Stuart Leighton reported that David Wilson Homes will fill the trench on Lower Calcott Lane; also the hedge along Shepherd's Lane has been cut and left hedge cuttings on the road.

SC Cllr Picton report: In her and Ed Potter's absence Lezley sent a written report; attached in minute book. It has important information about SC's financial situation, devolution, local mayors, police and crime commissioners and the Shropshire Local Plan.

- Flooding issues across the Severnway by The Crescent, Montford Bridge. The brook needs clearing for some distance and it is too big a job for volunteers to do. Rob Embrey of Grange Farm has 3.1
- promised to get a digger and do the work. New Welshpool Road markings by Elmar. These are such that they are confusing and dangerous. Turning right in to Calcott Lane used to have a wide turning lane it is now far too narrow. This is compounded by an apparent proposal, from Amwyl Homes, for 2 pedestrian crossings. Cllr Llewellyn will ask for advice from SC Cllr Lezley Picton. 3.2
- Grange Bank footway. Vegetation and soil, from the hedge base, is encroaching and halving the width of the already narrow footway. Cllr Blackmore has asked Kevin Williams if he can have a go at 3.3 shovelling the spoil back in to the hedge.

Deposit account £61,706.38; current account £36,043.34 Lloyds Bank is arbitrarily changing the BPC account from a 'Treasurers' to a 'Community Account' this will incur a standing charge of £4.25 per month. Noted. Muriel's Little Wood, Safety Report, *Standing Agenda Item.* Tom Llewellyn has volunteered to repair the fence. Many thanks to Tom. Jackie Brett had a polite word with some lads who were digging ramps to cycle over. The ramps are now much less and can safely be walked around. The wood is for 6.2 everyone and if it can accommodate young cyclists whilst not creating a danger to other users then that is a good use of the wood. Sue is to prepare some notices saying "No Digging".
- Vas, speed Indicator devices, a progress report. The devices are due for delivery. The insurance 6.3 situation is that currently "there is £34,000 worth of All Risks cover for your assets. Assuming your

total asset value hasn't exceeded this then the new VAS signs will be covered."

The estimated cost for the supply/installation of the 3No. posts will be £1200. Sue has volunteered to take delivery of the devices and to store them. The clerk will request of SC that the posts be installed asap.

Cost estimate; best guess from Dave Gradwell, "*I would say probably looking at between £5K £6K (design fees, legal speed limit TRO and construction costs).*" There is enough CIL to pay for this and BPC agrees to do it. Bicton Pool. "*A council can take action on unclaimed land by passing a resolution to manage it as a public open space*". Source- Open Spaces Society. BPC resolves, unanimously, to continue to manage Bicton pool as a public open space as it has been doing since 2010.
